2025 SOCIAL MEDIA AUDIT: PREPARING FOR THE VETTING CENTER

As of December 2025, USCIS mandates the disclosure of social media identifiers (handles) for all adjustment of status applicants. These are fed into the **Atlanta Vetting Center**, where Al-driven "sentiment analysis" and "risk scoring" are applied. Before you submit your application, conduct this 5-point audit to ensure your digital footprint doesn't trigger a fraud or security flag.

1. The "Consistency" Check (Employment & Education)

The Vetting Center's AI cross-references your **LinkedIn**, **GitHub**, **and Facebook** profiles against your **Form I-485** and your spouse's **I-864**.

- [] Job Titles: Does your current LinkedIn title match what you listed on your application?
- [] **Employment Gaps:** Are there any jobs listed on social media that you "forgot" to put on your form?
- [] **Education:** Does your listed university match your transcripts? Discrepancies here can trigger a **Material Misrepresentation** charge.

2. The "Relationship Timeline" Audit

For marriage-based cases, officers look for a "natural progression" of a relationship.

- [] **Status Updates:** Do your Facebook or Instagram relationship statuses match your marriage date? (e.g., still being listed as "Single" or "In a Relationship" with someone else after your marriage).
- [] **Photos & Tags:** Are there photos of you and your spouse together? Conversely, are there recent photos of you acting "single" or with ex-partners that could be misinterpreted by an AI bot?
- [] Public Posts: Does your "life story" online look like a couple living together?

3. The "High-Risk Keyword" Scan

The 2025 Vetting Center uses AI to flag "hostile intent" or "antisemitic/extremist activity" (as defined by **Executive Order 14161**).

- [] Political Content: Have you posted or "liked" content that could be interpreted as supporting extremist ideologies or hostile attitudes toward U.S. institutions?
- [] **Slang & Jokes:** Avoid jokes about "destroying" anything, "overstaying," or "working under the table." Al often fails to understand sarcasm or cultural slang.

• [] **Drug Use:** Even in states where marijuana is legal, any social media photos of drug use can lead to a finding of **inadmissibility** for "controlled substance" violations.

4. Privacy Settings & Disclosure

- [] List All Handles: You must provide every handle used in the last 5 years, including platforms like X (Twitter), Instagram, TikTok, Facebook, and foreign platforms (WeChat, VK, etc.).
- [] Public Visibility: Recent December 2025 directives suggest that keeping profiles
 "Private" during an active investigation may be viewed as an attempt to evade vetting.
 Consult with an attorney before changing your privacy settings.
- [] **Avoid Deletions:** Deleting your entire social media presence 24 hours before filing is a major "red flag" for fraud. It is better to have an honest, boring profile than a suddenly vanished one.

5. The "Third-Party" Footprint

You can't always control what others post, but USCIS sees it anyway.

- [] Search Your Name: Google yourself. What comes up?
- [] **Untag Yourself:** If friends have tagged you in "party" photos or controversial events that contradict your professional or marital image, untag yourself immediately.

A Note on the "First Amendment" in 2025

While you have a right to free speech, the 2025 vetting rules make it clear that a **visa is a privilege, not a right.** Information gathered from your "Online Presence" is routinely used to determine if you are a "positively contributing member of society."
